**The Metropolitan Museum of Art** is located at Fifth Ave and 82nd St. in New York City. Its collection includes more than three million works of art spanning 5,000 years of world culture, from prehistory to the present. There are 3 levels. Ground Level includes Costume Institute, The Robert Lehman Collection, The Uris Center, Auditorium and Library. The first floor houses the American Wing, Arms and Armor, Arts of Africa, Oceania and the Americas, Egyptian Art, European Sculpture and Decorative Arts, Grace Rainey Rogers Auditorium, Great Hall, Greek and Roman Art, Medieval Art, The Robert Lehman Collection and 20th Century Art. The second floor consists of The American Wing, Ancient Near Eastern Art, Asian Art, Chinese Art, Drawings, Prints and Photographs, European Paintings, Greek and Roman Art, Islamic Art, Japanese Art, Musical Instruments, 19th Century European Paintings and Sculpture, 20th Century Art, and South and Southeast Asian Art.

**The Cloisters** is the branch of The Metropolitan Museum of Art devoted to the art and architecture of medieval Europe. It was assembled from architectural elements, both domestic and religious, that date from the twelfth through the fifteenth century. The building and its cloistered gardens—located in Fort Tryon Park in northern Manhattan—are treasures in themselves, effectively part of the collection housed there. Because of its landmark status, The Cloisters has somewhat limited accessibility for visitors with mobility impairments.

### **Dining:**

Enjoy various dining options at the Museum, from the newly renovated cafeteria, to the American Art Café, and to the Petrie Court Café & Wine Bar overlooking Central Park.

### **Wheelchair Access:**

The 81<sup>st</sup> Street entrance to the Museum is the ground-level wheelchair-accessible entrance. Additionally, wheelchairs are available, free of charge, on a first-come, first-served basis at all coat-check areas.
