Gettysburg National Military Park Museum and Visitor Center: The Museum and Visitor Center at Gettysburg National Military Park is located just south of historic downtown Gettysburg, the Museum and Visitor Center features the exclusive Cyclorama, Film and Museum Experience. The Cyclorama, Film and Museum Experience includes the film, A New Birth of Freedom; the massive Cyclorama painting, which literally surrounds visitors with a magnificent visual of the fury of Pickett’s Charge, and the Gettysburg Museum of the American Civil War, featuring 12 exhibit galleries that contain artifacts and interactive displays.

Battlefield Tour: Experience countless stories and breathtaking landmarks, terrain, vistas and monuments on a 2 hour tour with a Licensed Battlefield Guide, who is licensed by the National Park Service as an historic interpreter of the major events for the three day Battle of Gettysburg.

Dobbin House Tavern: Dine in Gettysburg PA’s Oldest, Most Historic Home “...Beautifully and Authentically Restored” and open to the public as a colonial restaurant. (Deli Luncheon Buffet) Four Score and Seven years before the Civil War Battle of Gettysburg, (1776), Reverend Alexander Dobbin built a house to begin a new life in America for himself and his family. This facility is handicapped accessible.

Seminary Ridge Museum - Gettysburg Seminary Ridge Museum, which opened in 2013–150 years to the day after the Battle of Gettysburg began– features **20,000 square feet** of interactive exhibit galleries and educational programming to interpret three major areas of emphasis:

1. The pivotal first day of the Battle of Gettysburg on Seminary Ridge
2. The care of the wounded and human suffering within Schmucker Hall during its use as a Civil War field hospital
3. The moral, civic, and spiritual debates of the Civil War era.

Included in the museum admission is **“Soldiers of the Barricade”**. A lecture and question and answer session on the events that transpired during the battle.
