Cape May, the nation's oldest seaside resort, is known for its pristine beaches and Victorian heritage, as well as exceptional dining and shopping.

Beach Tags: Beach tags are required for all beaches. Tags are mandatory for everyone 12 years and older. Tags may be purchased at the access point of each beach as well as kiosks located on the Promenade at Madison Ave., Convention Hall and Broadway. Daily rate is \$6 per person and subject to change.

Beach: There are 25 guarded bath beaches along the 2.3 miles of the white sandy strand. Beach Patrol Hours are 10:00am – 5:00pm. Beach Patrol Headquarters is located at 206 Beach Ave at Grant St.

Public Restrooms: Beachfront public restrooms, rinse stations and water fountains (ADA Accessible) can be found at the following locations – Wilmington Ave., Trenton Ave., Philadelphia Ave., Gurney St., Grant St., Broadway and Second Ave. Center City restrooms (ADA Accessible) can be found at the following locations: Ocean St., North of Washington St. and Decatur St. at Lyle Ln.

Beach Concessions: A full array of food and non-alcoholic beverage items are available for purchase on the Beach at Broadway.

Cape May Trolley Service: Trolley runs in a continuous loop in Cape May and stops at any corner on the route from 12:00pm – 11:00pm. Price is \$1 one way and subject to change.

Washington Street Mall: The shops of Cape May's Washington Street Mall are privately or family owned. Several have been in the same families for generations. Awnings are still cranked down to shelter merchandise from the morning sun. Merchants can still be seen sweeping the sidewalks in front of their shops. Ice cream parlors, sidewalk cafes, and restaurants are everywhere offering an oasis of refreshment. Flowers abound. In the summer, the Mall is the place to explore and shop or eat. Enjoy the many fine stores and restaurants on Cape May's Washington Street Mall, where shopping and dining is a pleasure. With knowledgeable merchants, many special services and a large variety of merchandise at great prices, you'll discover Cape May's year round charm. In addition to its charming old buildings, Cape May's Washington Street Mall boasts several architecturally significant buildings and contains the largest collection of wealthy Victorian summer cottages and hotels in existence.
