Manassas National Battlefield Park – Guided Tour

The Manassas national Battlefield Park was established in 1940 to preserve the scene of two major Civil War battles. Located a few miles north of the prized railroad junction of Manassas, Virginia, the peaceful Virginia countryside bore witness to clashes between the armies of the North & South in 1861 & 1862. Today, more than 5,000 acres comprise the battlefield park, allowing the visitor to go explore the historic terrain where men fought and died for their beliefs a century ago.

Ben Lomond Historical Site

Ben Lomond and its outbuildings were constructed for Benjamin Tasker Chinn in 1832. Confederate forces used Ben Lomond as a hospital following the 1861 Battle of First Manassas. Signatures of Federal soldiers who occupied the property in 1862 are still visible inside the house. Tour the house, where you can smell, touch, hear and taste history. Then see the restored slave quarter, smokehouse and dairy and enjoy the fragrant Rose Garden.

Harper's Ferry – Guided Tour

The site of the famous John Brown's Raid in 1859, it also changed hands throughout the Civil War. When Lee was preparing to take the war to the north – also known as Lee's first invasion of the north – he sent Stonewall Jackson to capture Harpers Ferry in September of 1862 just prior to the Battle of Antietam.

The Bloodiest Day in American History--Hope for Freedom . 23,000 soldiers were killed, wounded or missing after twelve hours of savage combat on September 17, 1862. The Battle of Antietam ended the Confederate Army of Northern Virginia's first invasion into the North and led Abraham Lincoln to issue the preliminary Emancipation Proclamation.
