**Zabar's – 2245 Broadway**

Any wait you might encounter at this Upper West Side landmark is worth it. New Yorkers and out-of-towners—tens of thousands per week—come to Zabar's for some of the City's best coffee, bagels, smoked fish, cheeses and much more. Grab some goodies for a picnic in nearby Central Park, or load up on groceries to make a savory meal at home. Either way, how can you not love a place that once famously sold caviar at a loss in its zeal for offering the lowest price?

**Chelsea Market – 88 10<sup>th</sup> St**

Iconic culinary destination Chelsea Market has become an internationally-renowned brand and is considered one of the greatest indoor food and retail marketplaces in the world today. Located in the heart of New York City's Meatpacking District, the market's collection of distinctive and diverse merchants adds up to more than just your average food hall, rather a lively marketplace where one can shop the region's finest fishmonger, take home prime cuts of meat from one of the area's best whole-animal butchers, load up on artisanal cheeses, fresh produce, and imported Italian dry goods. It's the savory meals enjoyed at Chelsea Market; just as much as the fresh ingredients purchased there that make it a beloved destination for locals and travelers alike.

**Eataly – 200 5<sup>th</sup> Ave**

Eataly NYC Flatiron, the largest artisanal Italian food and wine marketplace in the world at 42,500 square feet, provides the unique opportunity for customers to shop, eat and learn. This collaboration between Mario Batali, Joe and Lidia Bastianisch and Eataly founder Oscar Farinetti has seven eateries offering pizza, pasta, meat, fish, vegetables, panini, gelato, pastries and coffee, plus a rooftop beer garden. The market sells the same quality meats, cheeses, pastas and vegetables used by the chefs, plus sauces and olive oil. A cooking school, bookstore and housewares section make it even easier to bring Italy to your home.

## Little Italy & Chinatown – Grand & Lafayette Streets

When Italian immigrants moved to this Manhattan neighborhood in the late 1800s, they brought their customs, food and language. That heritage remains evident today—Little Italy's streets are lined with restaurants serving Italian staples on red-and-white checkered tablecloths. Di Palo's cheese shop and Ferrara Bakery & Café—known for its cannoli and espresso—are among the long-tenured businesses still operating today.

**Chinatown New York City** is located in one of the oldest neighborhoods in Manhattan. Chinese immigrants settled in the area in the 1800's. Chinatown offers unique historical and cultural experiences not found anywhere else in the world.
