Zabar's – 2245 Broadway

Chelsea Market – 88 10th St

Iconic culinary destination Chelsea Market has become an internationally-renowned brand and is considered one of the greatest indoor food and retail marketplaces in the world today. Located in the heart of New York City's Meatpacking District, the market's collection of distinctive and diverse merchants adds up to more than just your average food hall, rather a lively marketplace where one can shop the region's finest fishmonger, take home prime cuts of meat from one of the area's best whole-animal butchers, load up on artisanal cheeses, fresh produce, and imported Italian dry goods. Little Italy & Chinatown – Grand & Lafayette Streets

When Italian immigrants moved to this Manhattan neighborhood in the late 1800s, they brought their customs, food and language. Di Palo's cheese shop and Ferrara Bakery & Café—known for its cannoli and espresso—are among the long-tenured businesses still operating today.
